- Provider of free online courses and educational resources in the UK and other European countries.
- OpenLearn "considers 'non-commercial' to include educational institutions, commercial companies or individuals making use of Open Learn content on a cost-recover basis." "You may use content as part of a course for which you charge an admission fee."

Open Textbook Library - <https://open.umn.edu/opentextbooks/>

- A "searchable online catalog of 'open textbooks'" curated and reviewed by the University of Minnesota.
- Information about the catalog (taken from the Open Textbook Library site)
- Openly Licensed. Acceptable licenses include Creative Commons Attribution, Attribution-Share Alike and Attribution-Noncommercial-Share Alike or similar. Some books may fall under a No-Derivatives license if the publisher offers an adequate customization program.
- Complete. Only complete books, similar to traditional textbooks currently on the market, are included. Materials such as lecture notes, online courses, or drafts, are provided only as supplements to textbooks listed in the catalog.
- Suitable for Adoption Outside the Author's Institution.
- Available in Print. Because most students still prefer print textbooks to digital, all textbooks include a print option, generally for \$40 or less. In some cases, textbooks without a print-on-demand option may be included if they are sufficiently easy and inexpensive to print locally.
- The majority of the content is licensed under a Creative Commons Attribution 3.0 license.

- Listed as an "educational content repository system."
- "Support the frictionless remixing of the content repository"
- All content is licensed under Creative Commons Attribution License (CC-BY).
- Allows students to view content on the Internet, download PDFs or EPUB versions, and, if deemed necessary, order low cost hard copy sets of the materials.

Creative Commons - <http://search.creativecommons.org/>

- The least restrictive license is the Attribution CC BY license. “This license lets others distribute, remix, tweak, and build upon your work, even commercially, as long as they credit you for the original creation.”

OER Commons - <http://www.oercommons.org/oer>

- Content created on their site is licensed under a Creative Commons Attribution-NonCommercial-ShareAlike 3.0 License.

Bookboon - <http://bookboon.com/>

- “Bookboon.com publishes free and openly available eBooks for students and business professionals. The books can be downloaded in PDF without registration.”
- Books are not available for customization, but can be linked.
- Would need to check to see if we could embed them in a course since this is a joint venture with partner universities.

- Links to a variety of open textbooks on the web.
- They do not hold the copyright to the textbooks, so each textbook would need to be reviewed for any copyright issues.

Global Textbook - <http://globaltext.terry.uga.edu/home>

- All textbooks published using a Creative Commons 3.0 license.
- Individual chapters are accessible in an open format. Chapters can be revised as needed.
