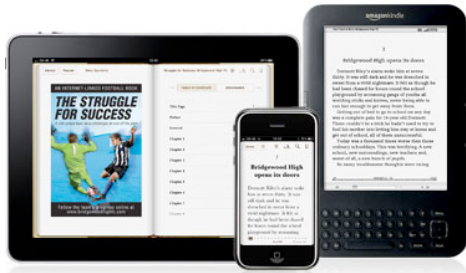


Helpful Tips & Strategies

- Select readings that contribute to the achievement of the course/module learning objectives.
- Whenever possible, add readings to the course files in the LMS.
- Keep readings focused – limit the required readings to topical selections.
- Include the most current articles and readings.
- Take advantage of Open Educational Resources, there are an abundance available through Creative Commons licenses.
- When linking to any reading resources external to the LMS, hyperlink text should be self describing to accommodate Section 508: ADA Compliance.

Textbooks can be expensive, and much of the topical instructional content can be located in less costly resources.
